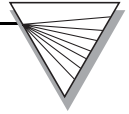

You may have noticed that sections of the fact book have been posted to the website during the last few months in the form of early releases.

The purpose of the fact book is to improve the quality and accessibility of information about the university by providing historically comparable, accurate, and relevant data. The highlights, tables, and graphics are designed to give the reader a better understanding of the most frequently requested statistical information about UNLV.

Past responses to the fact book demonstrate a variety of applications. The fact book is used as a source document in the self-study processes for internal program review and accreditation. It is most widely used by department chairs, committees, and campus administrators for resource acquisition, planning, assessment, and decision-making.
